WELCOME TO ADA!

→ COMPETITION

Competition will run according to the posted schedule. We ask all dancers to arrive at least 1.5 hours before their performance time, as events often run ahead. Dancers should check in with the backstage manager no later than 5 routines prior to their own. For a complete list of rules and regulations, please visit our website.

→ ADJUDICATION, SPECIAL AWARDS & OVERALLS

Each awards session will include adjudication for that session's entries as well as Special Awards. Adjudications are based on the scores given by our three scoring judges (see below). Our 4th judge is a Special Awards judge, who records critiques but does not score. This judge presents awards for such qualities as outstanding precision, use of staging and patterns, technical execution, emotional connection, and more! This awards presentation is full of valuable insights, teaching moments, and face to face recognitions. At ADA, our Special Awards are always personal and truly special.

Adjudication breakdown (Combined performance score from 3 judges):

- 230-239 High Bronze Medal
- 240-254 Silver Medal
- 255-269 High Silver Medal
- 270-284 Gold Medal
- 285-300 Ultimate Gold Medal

Select awards sessions will also include Overall Awards, as noted on the schedule. Overall Awards are separate for the Novice level and the Competitive level. Awards are also given for Ultimate Challenge Winners, Overall Highest Adjudication 12 & Under, 13 & Over, Excellence in Solo Choreography, Young Choreographer, and Diamond Choreography Award for group routines (competitive level routines only).

"Ultimate Challenge Winners" are presented to competitive soloists who receive a score of 290 or higher in the Senior, Teen & Junior Age Division (ages 10 & up) .. and a 287 or higher for Young (ages 7-9). These dancers are then invited to compete for America's Dancer of the Year at our national championship!




QUALIFICATION FOR THE AMERICAN DANCE AWARDS 2026 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP
